DONATION FOR INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

Due to Covid-19 outbreak that started in early of 2019, many students are affected financially due to part time shift reduction and job lost. As a part of their social and community service, Iizuka Friendship Network (I. F. N) had provide help for foreign students who are living in Iizuka by donating a bag of rice at two different times.

AA bag of 5kg of rice had been distributed to every foreign student studying in Kyutech. I.F.N had donated the rice in June 2020 and January 2021.

Iizuka City and support organization are also providing some foods to students once a month for free.

Scholarship HOLDER INTERVIEW



PERMPATDECHAKUL Thitipat (D1) from Suzuki and Panart Laboratory Kyutech. He is one of the students who received the Japan Society for the Promotion of Science (JSPS) Scholarship. He said "I' m very happy because throughout my master's in Kyutech, I studied without any scholarships, so it was very difficult" through his interview. His dream is to become a researcher, and with JSPS scholarship, "I got something to support my dream".

He wrote 9 pages of essay in English as one of the requirements for the scholarship application. Essays were about the research that he did during his master year, how his research can contribute to the world and the conference that he participated. Then, he also wrote about his research plan throughout his Doctor's year, reasons he selected Japan, what kind of researcher he wanted to be, and his plan after graduating. He used mind mapping techniques to organize his thoughts and ideas for the essays. Other requirements for this scholarship are the interview but due to Covid-19, the interview was cancelled. According to him, the hardest part while applying for this scholarship was to write about his research that can be easily understood by everyone.


He will be receiving this scholarship for two years, which is from his D2 (second year doctor) until D3 (third year doctor). The benefit of JSPS Scholarship besides monthly allowance is the scholarship also provides research allocation for laboratory up to ¥1, 500,000 per year.


Tips from him to those who intend to apply for this scholarship are quoted as below.

"the originality of your work is important. A good essay is where everyone can understand your work and you need to bear this in mind. Put a lot of figures so the readers can understand easier because figures are the first thing that will be seen by reviewers during essay selection. It is advisable to put figures and related sentences on one page. For example, the right side is the figure, and the left side is the explanation. And let your sensei and your friends read it to get feedback from them."

Lastly, he wished to say to everyone who's reading this,

"For me, everyone has the same opportunity to get a scholarship. Please don't think this scholarship is hard. If you have plans and ideas, you have to try to apply for this scholarship. Don't give up. Ganbatte!


